Welcome to your April newsletter from Linlithgow and Avon Valley Church of Scotland! This month, we have strong threads of local and global perspectives weaving together a diverse set of articles. As we head into the season where we celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus – a 1st century man from an obscure Jewish village, yet also the saviour of the world – it's good to remember that our concerns as people of faith are both immediate and international. As the slogan has it – Think Global, Act Local!

Manses and Ministry

As Session Clerk Tom Costley explained in the February newsletter (available here), we have many steps to undertake toward appointing a second full-time minister. One of these is to decide which of our two currently unoccupied manses – in Linlithgow and Torphichen – will be the manse for the new minister and family. (Church rules mean we can't leave the choice until later, or even let the new minister decide.)





Kirk Session on Tuesday 8th April considered a detailed report on the 2 manses. The report said each manse would, with some upgrading, be suitable in terms of accommodation and immediate environment; however, the Torphichen manse (pictured left / below) scored very high on questions of community presence and outreach. The recommendation was to retain Torphichen and to sell the manse in Philip Avenue, Linlithgow.

After a full debate, Session unanimously agreed the report. Once Presbytery approve the decision, work will begin to implement it.

Girls Brigade Thanks

The 1st Girls Brigade Company want to say a big thank-you to everyone who supported their coffee afternoon on 15 March. They were delighted to raise nearly £690 for company funds to help continue their work with girls from P1 up to S6.

World Watch Map available in every worship centre. While it's thought provoking and sobering, it is also witness to the transformational power of God and enables us, in prayer, to stand with fellow Christians across the world and make a difference.

An Astronaut Flew In...

Dr Kathy Sullivan – oceanographer, retired astronaut and global pioneer for women in science – landed on Monday 31st March for a whistlestop tour that included no fewer than four fundraising events for Aspire Linlithgow.

In just over 24 hours, Kathy addressed more than 500 people about her experiences from orbit to the very floor of the earth's oceans, linking them to St Michael's



role as the 'Challenger church' – the church whose great east window celebrates local scientist Charles Wyville Thomson and his key role in founding the science of oceanography.

The events have raised over £16,000 for Aspire Linlithgow's Project 600 campaign to put right major fabric issues in St Michael's Church. The fundraising team are aware there were some audibility issues during the Tuesday afternoon event in the church, and hope to have a full AV recording available shortly.

EASTER

Throughout Holy Week, Linlithgow Churches Working Together are mounting daily services involving all Linlithgow churches. Beginning on Palm Sunday (13th April) with a service at St Ninian's Craigmailen at 6:30pm, the services mix and match preachers and worship leaders with different churches from those they normally serve in.

The week culminates in the all-age service atop Cockleroi Hill at 9am on Easter Sunday (20th April) – always a joyous occasion as long as you remember to dress warmly! Full details of all services are on the Linlithgow Churches website.

Pray Every Day

Sunday: Pray for those in the parish who have recently been diagnosed with significant illness, that they and their families will know God's presence with them.

Monday: Pray for all who have been bereaved to experience God's comfort in their loss. Pray for bereavement team members as they support many of these people.

Tuesday: Pray for the Kirk Session as they still have many decisions to make following the creation of the new parish.

Wednesday: Pray for our political leaders, both in the UK and in Scotland, to be led by wisdom and compassion in the decisions they have to make.

Thursday: Pray for peace in global conflict zones. Israel/Palestine and Russia/ Ukraine are prominent in the media but there are significant areas of conflict elsewhere such as Syria, Yemen and much of Sub Saharan Africa.

Friday: Pray for our young people to experience peace of mind in the run up to important exams.

Saturday: Pray for our ministry team to have time for rest and restoration while they are carrying extra burdens at this time of transition in our congregations.
