




Generosity in Action

Over the last weekend of September, around 20 volunteers met at St Michael's to prepare for the mechanical platform to enter the church on Monday 29th for the planned stonework checking process.


The plan, masterminded by the Property Team, involved labelling all pews and then moving most of them. The AV equipment was dismantled, and other artefacts either moved to safety or covered with protective sheeting. The organ protection process was managed by a specialist team from Henry Willis & Sons Limited.

There were frequent breaks for fellowship, involving lots of tea and coffee, and of course excellent home baking, and the job was completed in record time - what a team! Work on the survey is now progressing at pace. We'll keep you posted!

Wednesday Night is Girls' Brigade Night

Girls Brigade meet every Wednesday night during term time in the Longcroft Halls. The Explorers (P1-P3) and Juniors (P4 – P7) meet from 6.15pm to 7.30pm and the Brigaders (S1 upwards) meet from 6.30pm – 7.45pm. We have great fun playing games, listening to stories, doing crafts and activities and learning new songs.

This year our Focus is on Healthy Lifestyles: recently we learned about Harvest foods and the tools and machines used to harvest the crops. The younger girls coloured in Harvest pictures, and the older ones completed a wordsearch.





Bethany Meals

A team of enthusiastic volunteers from our parish has been supporting Bethany Christian Trust for the past 20 years. At least 5 times a year between October and April, we prepare dinner and lunch sandwiches for about 50 homeless people in Edinburgh. The food is bought and prepared off site by our volunteers, then delivered to the accommodation centre where we serve it to those in need.

Each meal costs at least £110. We'd really appreciate
