


#### **Scotland Demands Better**

**Monday**. Pray for our Nominating Committee to know God's guidance and wisdom as it begins its work in looking for a second minister.


**Tuesday**. Pray that our Session Clerk Tom Costley will continue to have the wisdom, drive and support needed for all his responsibilities.
