Seven days to Make a Difference

This week (**11th-17th May**) is Christian Aid Week 2025. You can help make a difference worldwide for farmers like Aurelia from Guatemala. Supported by specialist agricultural training from a local organisation funded by Christian Aid, she and other farmers in her community have adapted sustainable practices such as producing their own organic fertiliser





Despite climate change, the community has demonstrated huge resilience to transform

their output. As <u>Christian Aid</u> say, Aurelia is now holding hope in her hands. You can bring hope as you donate online through the Linlithgow Christian Aid envelope.

Connect Locally and Globally

Did you know that Linlithgow and Avon Valley Parish is a Gold Award eco-congregation? Working with organisations such as Christian Aid, <u>Eco Congregation Scotland</u> is an ecumenical programme that helps make connections between Christian faith and environmental issues.

Key Points from Kirk Session

Our Kirk Session met this week in the delightful surroundings of the St John's Hall in Torphichen. These are a few key points from a wide-ranging agenda:

- The congregational annual meeting will take place at 7pm on **Tuesday 24th June** in the Kirk Hall at Cross House, Linlithgow. Come along to hear what's going on and to meet fellow members from around our enlarged parish!
- Session agreed that communion bread should always be gluten free, and that a nonalcoholic alternative to wine should always be available.
- A memorial to Linlithgow munitionette workers who died in a wartime factory explosion will be installed next to the Linlithgow war memorial in St Michael's in time for this year's Remembrance Sunday.
- The communications team are developing a new cross-parish magazine, with the first issue expected over the summer.
- The fundraising team are applying to the Church of Scotland General Trustees to help fund phase 1 of 'Project 600' (works to remove damp and woodworm issues in the church), and to the National Lottery Heritage Fund to support major works on Cross House.
- Financially, we have a significant challenge to ensure our income keeps pace with increasing costs.

The King of Instruments



The next Occasionally@St Michael's concert – on Sunday 18th May at 3pm - is a treat, as St Michael's own organist Dr John Willmett explores the splendours of our Henry Willis organ in a varied recital that includes Elgar, Mendelssohn and J S Bach.

It's astonishing now to remember that this wonderful instrument mouldered quietly in a Yorkshire barn between the closure of the school in Harrogate for which it was built and its transfer to St Michael's in 2001.

Entry is free with donations invited for upkeep of the organ.



Linlithgow String Orchestra in Training

In its 10th year, the Linlithgow String Orchestra has embarked on its most ambitious project to date. Working with Edinburgh-based composer Deborah Shaw, they will create a new bespoke composition to mark the bicentenary of the railways' birth in the UK. While details remain under wraps until the world premiere in Linlithgow on 9th November, the piece promises to capture the breath, hiss and heartbeat of steam in motion.

Composer Deborah Shaw is a real steam enthusiast!

In the meantime, the group's upcoming concert will be full of beautiful tunes including Ronald Binge's "Sailing By" (aka The Shipping Forecast theme) and a special arrangement of Johann Strauss's "Roses of the South". It's such a good programme that you can enjoy it twice: at the Priory Church, South Queensferry on Saturday 7th June at 7pm, and in Linlithgow Burgh Halls on Sunday 8th June at 2.30pm. Full steam ahead!

Church member Susan Denholm is holding an open garden event on **Saturday 21st June from 1.30pm-4.30pm** as a fundraiser for Aspire Linlithgow's Project 600 campaign to address major fabric issues in St Michael's church. The garden at Lochmill House, 3 Lade Court is beautifully laid out: amongst other attractions, it includes 36 varieties of clematis to ensure at least one is

always in flower!

The house is found just beyond the large brick house at the end of Mill Lade, and can also be accessed via the path from Avalon Gardens. (Sorry – no parking at the house.) Entry is £5 and tea, coffee and home baking will be available for a modest charge.





Build That Wall

That famous parable about building on strong foundations has recently been re-enacted in our midst. The wall at the Longcroft Halls by St Ninian's Craigmailen has been dismantled and comprehensively re-built. While removing the risk of collapse, the project undertaken by Stewart and his team from Stonemasonry Scotland has also generated many positive comments for the quality of their work.

The project was managed by Bert Laing and Jim McFadyen from St Ninian's Craigmailen. Bert was even allowed to assist (briefly).

Don't Discard: Recycle!

Discarded electricals are the fastest-growing source of waste in the UK: we bin over 100,000 tonnes every year. Electrical items, many of which contain rare metals, can be recycled at most local authority recycling centres.

In addition, at Linlithgow Tesco in Linlithgow, Lidl Bathgate & Dunelm Mills, Falkirk you can recycle many electricals, including air fryers, doorbells, hair straighteners, flat screen TVs & more. Vapes can even be recycled at VPZ in the Regent Centre, Linlithgow.



A further option is to use a website like <u>Freegle</u> or <u>Freecycle</u>: it's amazing what people are delighted to take off your hands. Make someone's day while you declutter.
