A large congregation joined Presbytery Moderator Rev Andrea Price in the recent Service of Union to mark the creation of Linlithgow and Avon Valley Church of Scotland. During the event held in St Ninian's Craigmailen on 13th November, Rev Dr Liam Fraser and Rev Thom Riddell officially became respectively minister and auxiliary minister of the new parish.

As well as welcoming Liam and Thom into their new roles, the congregation pledged on our behalf "In the presence of God and depending on his help, to be faithful to the covenant of unity, love and peace into which we are now entering, for the better service of Christ's kingdom and the glory of his name". Avonbridge Anew?

Proposals for a major revamp of Avonbridge Church's interior were unveiled at a community engagement coffee morning in the church hall on 9th November. Building on community consultation led by Dan Rous, architectural drawings showed in 2D and 3D alike how the space inside the church could be opened up for both community and church use. Two further features of the drawings are attractive re-use of the wood from the pews into various architectural features – and the uncovering of the rose window that has been hidden since the 1960s!



Excellent tea, coffee and baking all contributed to an exciting morning as efforts continue to chart a positive future for Avonbridge Church.



Session Underway

The single Kirk Session for the new parish is well and truly up and running, with its first full meeting taking place on Tuesday 26 November. 


