



WEDNESDAY Give thanks for completion of the work on the spire and the publicity surrounding it; pray for the next phases of the Aspire Linlithgow campaign and for our fundraising team as they lead this work.

THURSDAY Pray for those affected by devastating floods in the south of Brazil to receive food and shelter, and for all trying to provide assistance to them.

FRIDAY Pray that all the house groups and Bible study groups in the congregation will provide fellowship and helpful teaching to those who attend.

SATURDAY Pray for the ministry team, and especially for Liam as he leads it, that they will know God's guidance and wisdom in all they do.



Speaking of Liam

We know Rev Dr Liam J Fraser as a great preacher, a supportive pastor and a forward-thinking leader. He also serves as the Convenor of the Church of Scotland's Theological Forum. What that bland title doesn't tell you is that the Theological Forum is where the church sends the some of the trickiest issues of the day for wise counsel.

Earlier this week, at the 2024 General Assembly, Liam presented the Forum's report on topics such as: modernising the Westminster Confession (one of the Church's foundation documents); conversion therapy; and transgender identities in the Church of Scotland. On this, the crux of the report was that people presenting a diverse gender identity "must be welcomed without reserve into the worship and prayer life of the Church".

Mulanje Mission Hospital, Malawi

The retiring collection after this Sunday's quarterly Communion will support the fantastic work of Mulanje hospital in Malawi. In one of the world's poorest countries, Mulanje provides a wide-ranging care programme, from ante-natal through to palliative care. It trains new nurses and doctors and works in remote communities, as well as in the hospital. It also extends its work to help the community at large via several imaginative projects.
